Our schools have consistently performed at the top end of this competition and it is always considered by our junior racers to be the highlight of the year's events. This year we returned with a predominantly Year 10 team, with a good amount of experience and a variety of skills. The week comprised of multi-sport races, problem solving activities, and orienteering. This took place on Great Barrier Island and they raced for 5 days against the 11 other top teams in the country. At the end of the week students clocked in 60km on foot, not to mention around 12km of kayaking.

Our goals this year were to race hard and place in the top 3, but above all work together as a team no matter what happens. I can safely say that our team achieved all of these goals with great pride and determination. After the first three days we found out that we were leading by one point which made teams realize just how close the competition was. However with the two biggest point days still to come, anything could've happened, and did.

Unfortunately, the multisport race did not go in our favour and after a raft strap snapping, we were an hour behind Waimea College, which put them over a hundred points in front. However, the navigation day saw our team really play to their strengths and although we gained the most points by a landslide, it was not enough to take out the lead Waimea had gained. This saw us finish a very close second place overall, a huge accomplishment for our students and one they can feel very proud of.
